5/20/2012 Greetings from Chicago

Warren's email says, "We have had a great 10 days since my last update: 3 days in Boston, 3 days in Maine, 3 days in Pennsylvania, and now we are back in Cleveland, Ohio, where we lived for 34 years. Boston is even more unrecognizable since we were last there – a bout the only familiar places were MIT, Back Bay (where Ginny lived), and Faneuil Hall (which stands alone in a formerly populous market area, now surrounded by super highways and heavily traveled roads.) Because of the rough roads in Boston, we lost a fuel pump on I-95, had to be towed, but were back on the road in 4 hours (probably a new world's record!)

In Ocean Park, Maine, we stayed in Mary Kerrigan's (Ginny's old boss) B&B, and ate clams and lobster at every opportunity. We were invited to Mother's Day dinner with Mary's family, so we drove to Wellesley, Massachusetts, for dinner, and back the same evening (those small eastern states again).

In Cleveland we are visiting old friends and the house we lived in for 31 years. The present owners were very hospitable, taking us through the house and letting us roam the yard taking pictures and looking at all the trees we planted)my favorite is a white oak which I put in as a sapling – it is now 2 and a half feet in diameter and at least 50 feet tall). The house has had changes made by a succession of owners in the last 18 years, but it is still the house we built and loved – miraculously the dark woodwork has been preserved, and the present owners love it as it is – all the work that we put inhas been carefully preserved, and on the whole, the changes are improvements. On Tuesday we leave for Chicago to see our daughter and son, and their families. Warren
