## **MPC Christian Spirituality Study Begins New Book**

Our new reading is <u>The God Who Speaks – Learning the Language of God</u> by Dr. Ben Campbell Johnson, Professor Emeritus of Christian Spirituality at Columbia Theological Seminary outside Atlanta, Georgia. Ben is the founder of the Spiritual Formation Certificate Program at Columbia, Pittsburgh and Austin Theological Seminaries.

How often have you thought or heard others say "Is God Speaking to Me?" Did you know that God communicates with us in different ways?

In exploring these different modes of "GodSpeech", Johnson will guide us into the practices of "intentional listening", a way of posing issues to God and discerning His response.

Johnson explores the biblical foundations of divine communications and then gleans important lessons about God's language to us from a wide range of Christian leaders through history.

At a time when many Christians hunger for a more personal, meaningful connection with God, Johnson tells us how to discern divine language and forge a closer, richer relationship with "the God Who Speaks".

The Christian Spirituality Study meets every Wednesday at 3:00 p.m. in the Library of Preston Hall across from the Sanctuary.
