MENDOCINO PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH - ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING FEBRUARY 23RD, 2020

After morning worship, the meeting convened at 12:20 in Preston Hall moderated by Reverend Matthew E. Davis. Pastor Matt opened the meeting with words from Isaiah, prayer and leading singing of the first verse of Great is thy Faithfulness.

A handout of the financial statements, minutes from 2/10/2019 meeting, Pastor report and report from Mendocino Redwood Retreat was available for those present. A Quorum was registered (40 people in attendance) including seven current elders.

2019 Annual Congregational Meeting minutes:

Minutes from the 2/10/2019 congregational meeting were reviewed. Susan Holli made one correction in the minutes in the section of terms of call "motion to increase the pastor's salary **by** \$...." instead of "to".

Motion to approve minutes Bill Scott, second Darlene Clay. Minutes approved as corrected.

2020 Budget and Financial Report - Elder Kathy Hart and Treasurer Bill Scott:

Kathy Hart and Treasurer Bill Scott prepared the end of year 2019 financial report as well as the 2020 budget as approved by session at the February 19th meeting. A power point presentation was used to graphically illustrate the previous pledging history and the breakdown of ministry spending for our congregation. Kathy presented broad information regarding the budget process including information about the per capita requirement for our members.

Bill Scott spoke to the year end, explaining that although the "bottom line" appeared favorable, the actually deficit of pledges and tithes to regular expenses was approximately {-\$58.000}. This past year the church spent out of the designated funds in order to meet expenses. The 2020 budget reflects a lower percentage of this type of funding.

Kathy encouraged the attendees to reflect on gratitude and how God can use our efforts even when it is difficult. There was a good discussion with questions and answers regarding pledges, rental income, mission budget, legacy giving, the opportunity for visitors to MPC assisting in our mission, attracting seminary student involvement, new members, community involvement and how the faith component of our church budget expects the best, but must be aware of "the worst" in terms of finances. Members of the finance team were thanked with a yellow rose – Bill Scott, Warren Wade, Norma Lea Andres, Paul Beadleston and MPC Financial Secretary Michael

Affirmation of 2020 Terms of Call for Rev. Matthew E. Davis:

After requesting Pastor Matt and family to be briefly excused, Brandt Stickel acted on behalf of the personnel committee to explain the current status for the pastor's terms of call. The approved budget did not address any changes in the current terms of call for Pastor Matt. Unfortunately due to illness and loss of several elders this past year, the personnel committee had not met this past year to review the compensation of the pastor or other personnel at MPC. This situation needs to be addressed with another elder taking a lead for personnel and reestablishing the committee. There was discussion about the proper method to review the terms of call, as there is no vote required if there is not a change. Many members reflected on the many gifts Pastor Matt has shared with our community and congregation and the awareness of the Holy Spirit moving in our midst. A motion was made by Bill Scott and seconded by Darlene Clay for the personnel committee to reconvene and evaluate the Pastor's current terms of call and to come back to the congregation in approximately 2 months if they feel a change to the terms of call should be made. It was recommended a salary review from presbytery should be used for evaluation. A change in the Pastor's terms of call would require a congregational vote which would require a two week notice. Other adjustments in staff would be through the Session.

Matt, Jennifer and Drew were welcomed back with standing ovation and roses.

Pastor's Report on Ministry – Rev. Matthew E. Davis:

Pastor Matt gave summary view of various ministries from this past year with the theme – surprised by hope. Included in the report was the remembrance of those who had passed away in 2019.

Pastor Matt thanked Tammy Fites for her unending energy in the managing of the church office.

 - Tuesday meals put together by "dynamic duo" Jim Hunter and Lynn Beckley with homebaked cookies by Betty Freeman
 - Thursday Food Pantry run by Kristi Hollcraft with Matt Leach and other volunteers.
 - Our ministry attracted outsiders to offer items for the homeless.
- MPC support to mission projects was crucial during the pandemic:
 - Patrick Rickon writes: "We decided to embark on a number of new initiatives and strategies to keep our work and mission moving forward in spite of the challenges at hand....and developed a more intense focus on a Book Lending Initiative... committed ourselves to an On-line Book Cataloging effort.
 - Pastor Marc in Jacmel Haiti said the annual retreat we support brought hundreds from highland churches to be baptized and some 10 couples to be wed in a community celebration.
 - In Minembwe in the DRC, 150 people whose huts were burned by Mai Mai are being housed in Moriah Africa's training center, and with severe food shortage each family has a plot to grow food.
 - Center for the Handicapped in Rwanda used MPC's support to buy food, Continued next page and bedding for children since the pandemic had cut off other sources or support.
 - YWAM team- Hunter and Alexey—prepare to return to Azerbaijan to continue outreach ministry to Muslims as soon as travel restrictions are lifted

Highlights:

- Established a group of Partners in Ministry for MPC's Financial Future to tackle MPC financial challenges during COVID-19. This group was later renamed the Finance Committee, which included active participation by finance staff and members of the MPC congregation. They developed a committee structure, along with roles and responsibilities that helped to improve communication between the Finance Committee, Session and MPC congregation.
- Special thanks to Treasurer William Scott, Accounting Team member Warren Wade and Mission Elder Kathleen Alexander who worked to update and streamline the listing of Designated Gift Funds. Within the listing, an responsible Elder was designated to oversee each DGF line item.
- Developed an on-line portal on the MPC web site that enables the congregation, long-time visitors and external donors to give to MPC electronically. Accounting Team member Norma Lee Andres developed procedures to assist everyone in using the on-line portal.
- Developed a Designated Gift Fund Procedure to support Elders and Finance Committee in being even more responsible for tracking and dispensing funds in a timely manner.
- MPC applied for and received a loan of \$48,295 from the SBA Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), part of the CARES Act from the national government. With the support of the PPP Loan Oversight Team, extra work on behalf of MPC's Accounting Team and MPC staff the loan was 100% forgiven. A special thank you to Olivia Jung, Meili Daniel, Drew Davis, Justin Daniel, and Lily Jung who worked on special clean-up projects at the church to use the PPP loan funds within the allotted time.
- Conducted a finance study of churches within the Redwood Presbytery to identify opportunities for improvement. The results of this study were used to make procedural changes in 2020, along with improvements for 2021. One of the most significant was improved and even more transparent accounting reports, enabling both Session and the congregation to discern how money is received and spent at MPC.
- Conducted a 2021 Stewardship Campaign that witnessed a first time drive-thru to drop off pledges at the church and, thanks to the congregation, raised over \$165,000 in future pledges and tithes, as well as six new pledging donors. A special thanks to Meili Daniel and Drew Davis who videotaped members of Session and the congregation sharing current and future projects for MPC.

What Were Your Joys in 2020?

- 1. My first joy was successful cataract surgery on both of my eyes. Besides the clarity of textual material it has also resulted in brighter more distinctive colors.
- 2. My second joy was to identify Synod of the Pacific funds that could possibly be used in the Slope area of our property south of our parking lot. Once found and passed on to Susan Holli, the other half of this particular joy was convincing my colleagues on the Synod Mission Partnership Committee, that I co-chair, that our proposal written by Susan Holli should be passed by the Committee and the Synod.

What Were Your Challenges and Opportunities in 2020?

Challenge:

 The worldwide Coronavirus Pandemic has had special consequences all around Planet Earth including Mendocino Presbyterian Church. It has significantly affected financial markets in all continents, including here in the United States. After I retired I became an investor. When the pandemic hit the most widely known market, the Dow Jones Average Index dropped over 20%. Investment obligations I had bought from European banks were mandatorily redeemed by those banks at outrageous discounts because of the run on the financial markets. This has left me scrambling financially but I am pleased to report that I am recovering.

Opportunity:

1. As I reflect on the financial panic and the stress that it placed on my life, the events of last year have forced me to focus more on the one who has never failed me - our Trinitarian God: our Holy Father, our Holy Brother, Jesus the Christ, and the Omnipresent Holy Spirit. Last year as I prayed for God's presence more vigorously in my life, I began to experience his increased presence and love for me, even as now as I share these words with you. It is been a remarkable journey solidifying my already solid Faith in Him. For twenty years I have been a student of a two thousand year tradition in our church known as Christian mysticism, studying the lives of Christian mystics in North Africa, Southern and Western Europe and the Middle East who had direct experiences of fellowship and communion with our Heavenly Father for over twenty centuries. With my turmoil and stress of the last twelve months, I can more clearly cling to our Triune God and more wonderfully have a dynamic, direct personal relationship with Him. For that I am eternally grateful.

- 1. Continue to build my personal, direct fellowship and communion with God.
- 2. For opportunities to continue to serve my denomination, the Presbyterian Church (USA)
- 3. More opportunities for bringing our Savior to people on the Mendocino Coast through a radio show I am planning.
- 4. Exploring new ministries for Mendocino Presbyterian Church by learning about new evangelism formats from the new experiences we have had over the last year.
