Dear Mendocino Presbyterian Church,

Over the last five months a team of MPC leaders have been working with Rev. Jim Kitchens (from the consulting team called PneuMatrix) and our congregation to affirm the MPC vision and mission as we enter 2022. The following is their statement:

This vision is invitational in nature and assumes that God's church is expansive and inclusive yet intimate and personal. That is the way of Jesus!

Now comes the exciting work?

How might you use your gifts to live into this vision?

As we ramp up church life following the last two years of COVID, there is much opportunity to support the work of our committees and teams like the Worship Committee, Mission Committee, Facilities Team, New Member Team and Christian Education Teams. Call me at 707-337-9045 and I would be delighted to share the important work being done in these areas and where we need your help. I especially want to encourage you to seek our Director of Music Marie-Claire Dizin if you are interested in singing. Now is the time—as was stated above—to "sing with the joyful!"

I am challenged by the third vision invitation...

"Listening to those who want a voice."

As Presbyterians we are called to be concerned about the larger community and so I feel personally called at this time to listen to the Pomo People (Coyote Band) who are trying to find a seat at the table with California State Parks and the writing of the timber harvest plans for Jackson Demonstration State Forest. Currently--and once again--the Pomo are on the outside looking in. Why is Pomo leadership not part of the decision-making process? This doesn't seem right especially when considering the historic displacement and marginalization of the Pomo peoples from these same forests being considered for harvesting. Coyote Tribal Chairman Michael Hunter is requesting a moratorium on future timber harvest plans to allow time for Cal State Parks to adjust their process simply asking that tribal leadership have a voice in this process. Seems like a simple and just request. However, for politicians to listen to those who want a voice...other must stand with the members of the Coyote band. This isn't an argument about clear cutting or selective cutting...this is institutional question of who is at the decision-making table.

Over the next weeks, I will post opportunities where you can learn more about this issue and hear directly from the Pomo people who are hoping to have their voice heard. I am not stating that you need to agree with their point of view but I do believe we have the Christian opportunity to listen. This is at the heart of Christianity. This is what makes the Mendocino Presbyterian Church a special place because--at our best--we listen for the Spirit of God working in the lives of those around us.

Please share with me those issues which stir your heart and raise question in your mind about peoples that we forget or leave out.

I hope that we will see you again in worship at 11 AM on Sundays where we can listen to God in new ways walking in companionship with Jesus.

MPC Session Notes and Communications:

- 1) Approval at the February 16, 2022 Session meeting of a MPC Mission Committee feasibility study considering the impact of a deepening partnership with the Fort Bragg Food Bank through the transformation of the "Music Box" into an expanded community pantry. Session approved Elder Kathleen Alexander being the official liaison to the Fort Bragg Food Bank. One hope is that other uses of the current Music Box might emerge.
- 2) Rev. Matthew Davis updated MPC Session on his Doctor of Ministry program with Drew University in New Jersey. Rev. Davis' program is focused on questions regarding pilgrimage. One aspect of pilgrimage of particular interest is that of "placemaking". Placemaking is the study of how human beings give meaning to "spaces" thereby making them "places" defined as areas of meaning and purpose. One such space is below our MPC parking lot. How might that area become a welcoming place? How might that area tell stories of who we are as a community and church? A MPC "Placemaking Project" will be shared with the congregation in May, June and July.
- 3) Approval to invite students to participate in a MPC High School Wilderness Program entitled "God and the Grand Canyon: Looking at Life from the Top-Down and the Bottom-Up" from April 10th to April 17th. (See full description on page 9)
- 4) Approval of Mendocino Film Festival to use Preston Hall from June 1 to June 6 in exchange for being named "Festival Sponsor" valued at \$1,000. MFF Executive Director Angela Matano is so excited to be able to use Preston Hall as a "Welcome Center" for the 2022 film festival. Mendocino Presbyterian Church will be given a number of pro bono tickets so please contact Office Manager Tamara Fites if you would like your name on the list.
- 5) MPC Clerk of Session Elizabeth Vrenios-Kirkpatrick was informed on March 2, 2022 that the Community Foundation of Mendocino County has approved a \$20,000 gift to help repair the north side roof of Preston Hall. Thanks to Paul Douglas, Scott Anderson and Matt Davis for writing this grant to the Community Foundation. Repairs will be scheduled probably in August 2022. Thanks for your patience in advance.

The per capita contribution breakdown for 2022


